What is a “major” rink?

Has hockey boards

Has change area that is used by skaters (i.e. not permanently locked)

Can be permitted out for hockey

Has onsite staff during rink hours

“In addition to forepersons, there are 80 parks staff members dedicated to the maintenance of outdoor rinks. There are 36 maintenance staff assigned to the South district.”
